

Things to Research

- ◆ Email or call the local Chamber of Commerce where you would like to visit and ask them to send you a package of information containing places to see, eat, and visit. It's free!
- ◆ Research the city for different attractions or local historic places to visit.
- ◆ If you find a place you would like to visit, ask if they have group discounts to local attractions.
- ◆ Find out about local transportation. Incorporate local transportation as you travel around a city. Some cities have trolleys, buses, or subways that can relieve you of the stress of finding a place to park.
- ◆ Web sites like www.tripadvisor.com can be a great place to find reviews on hotels and sights in the area written by people that have actually visited.
- ◆ Consider renting a car to save you wear and tear on your car. If you have a car that is not fuel efficient, you could save money on gas by renting a fuel efficient one.
- ◆ Find a safe place to stay by going to www.state.gov
- ◆ Call or go online to see if discounts from places such as AAA, AARP, Military, etc. are available.
